

James A[lexander] Hamilton to MVB, 15 June 1815

Private

Dr. sir.

I have made arrangements for the payment of to <Mr> King the amount of his a/c you will therefore give yourself no further trouble on that Subject. I find there is no such thing as getting you to attend to Small matters now, and must therefore proceed to revive the Judgt against John [. . .] and Issue Execution for the [. . .] as taxed in doing which I do not [. . .] you will accuse me of more haste tha[n] is proper. Let me know the amt of <Clerks> Bill. That I may pay it Jacob R. Van Rensselaer. Who is an honorable man charges me in a/c with 6 <illegible> \$ paid Van Vechten. atty Genl. for <Clerks> fees can I know if I have received such a credit and if the a/c amt. ^ you demand is a Ballance or what. I feel much interest in ascertaining these facts at as Early a day as I can civilly & Politially you know my opinion & when it will answer any good purpose others shall also Know it. My Sci fa will be returned in Augt. next.
